The Barrel

Anabel Rodriguez Rios | 2012 | 5 min Finland | Spanish with English subtitles | 8+ years

More than anything else, 13 year old Luis wants a used oil barrel so he can make a boat and enter a race. He lives on a floating village in the middle of the Maracaibo Lake, one of the main oil reserves in Venezuela, where every day 832 000 barrels of oil are extracted.

Meghna Gupta | 2016 | 14 min India | Jatu, Punjabi with English subtitles | 12 + years

This is the final resting place of your cast-off clothing. When people in the West throw their clothes away, their cast-offs often go on a journey east, across the oceans, to India's industrial interior. Garment recyclers take huge bundles of clothes donated from across the world, and turn them into wool. With little exposure to Western culture other than the Discovery Channel, the garment recyclers rely on their imagination and the rumours that travel with the cast-offs to create an intriguing perspective on the West.
